Letter to Inside Housing

I was very disappointed with the article in last week's edition stating that the NFA is supporting further regulation of the sector (ALMO federation calls for "active regulator").

For many year's, the ALMO sector was robustly regulated by the Audit Commission and in many ways it was a useful tool to drive improvements in governance and service delivery. The topic is still discussed on occasions within the sector, but it is a massive leap to turn this into a headline stating that the NFA is now asking for return to stronger regulation.

I want it put on record that the NFA does not have a formal position on this subject and it has not approved a policy asking for more active regulation.
